JOB DESCRIPTION**

JOB TITLE: Life Safety Training Specialist (PT)
DEPARTMENT: City Manager/Fire Administration
FLSA STATUS: Non-exempt

GENERAL PURPOSE:

Performs intermediate-level technical or specialized work in the Fire Administration division. Develops, coordinates, schedules, and conducts fire and life safety public education and community outreach programs. Work is performed under general supervision of the Fire Marshal or designee with limited latitude. Position exercises some judgment in accordance with well-defined policies, procedures, and techniques.

EXAMPLES OF ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The list of essential functions, as outlined herein, is intended to be representative of the tasks performed within this classification. It is not necessarily descriptive of any one position in the classification. The omission of an essential function does not preclude management from assigning duties not listed herein if such functions are a logical assignment to the position.

- Develops, coordinates, schedules, and conducts fire prevention and safety public education programs
- Develops, coordinates, schedules, and conducts life safety public education programs, including but not limited to cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), first aid, and basic life support (BLS)
- Presents to schools, day care centers, businesses, and the community, with audiences comprised of adults, children, and special needs populations, adjusting presentation style as necessary to suit the audience
- Coordinates the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and attends City events to provide first aid and demonstrations
- Participates in Broward County's Juvenile Firesetter Prevention and Intervention Program
- Coordinates resources and participates in community outreach events and media related public education demonstrations
- Performs other related duties as assigned and/or required

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

High school diploma or GED; supplemented by at least two (2) years' experience in developing and conducting educational and/or recreational programs, preferably related to fire and life safety; an equivalent combination of education, certification, training, and/or experience may be considered.

Must have a state of Florida driver license, class E; cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid and basic life support (BLS) instructor certifications; and National Incident

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Management System (NIMS) Introduction to Incident Command System (ICS) 100, 200, 700 and 800 training.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Knowledge of life safety and fire prevention public education program development and delivery methods and trends
- Skill in Microsoft Office products (Word, Outlook, PowerPoint, and Excel)
- Skill in providing good customer service
- Ability to develop and present fire and life safety education programs and curriculum
- Ability to learn the specialized vocabulary associated with fire administration and safety
- Ability to multi-task while working with tight deadlines and shifting priorities
- Ability to analyze and define problems, identify alternative solutions, estimate consequences of proposed actions, and implement recommendations in support of goals
- Ability to organize work for timely completion
- Ability to clearly communicate and understand information in English, both orally and in writing
- Ability to establish and maintain effective and cooperative working relationships with those contacted in the course of work
- Ability to regularly attend work and arrive punctually for designated work schedule

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Depending on functional area of assignment, tasks involve the periodic performance of moderately physically demanding work, usually involving lifting, carrying, pushing and/or pulling of moderately heavy objects and materials (up to 50 pounds). Tasks that require moving objects of significant weight require the assistance of another person and/or use of proper techniques and moving equipment. Tasks may involve some climbing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, or crawling. Tasks may involve extended periods of time at a keyboard or work station and extended periods of time standing and/or walking.

ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS:

Tasks are regularly performed inside and/or outside with potential for exposure to adverse conditions, such as dirt, dust, pollen, odors, fumes and/or poor ventilation, wetness, humidity, rain, temperature, and noise extremes, machinery and/or moving vehicles, vibrations, electric currents, animals/wildlife, toxic/poisonous agents, gases or chemicals, oils and other cutting fluids, violence and/or disease, or pathogenic substances.

SENSORY REQUIREMENTS:

Some tasks require manual dexterity, in addition to visual and hearing acuity.

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The job description does not constitute an employment agreement between the City and employee and is subject to change by the City as the needs of the City and requirements of the job change.
